



# Year 4 Spring (1)

## English

### **Key Text: 'How to Train your Dragon' by Cressida Cowell**

This half term, your child will continue to develop their descriptive writing techniques in narratives, punctuate speech correctly and practise writing more complex sentences. They will also be learning how to write letters and persuasion texts. They will be encouraged to start joining their letters correctly in their writing. In reading, they will be improving their fluency when reading aloud, develop their vocabulary and how to use evidence in the text to support their opinions. In spelling, they will be learning to spell words beginning with 'gu', ending in 'ture', homophones and the use of the possessive apostrophe with plurals. They will also be learning how to spell and use the Y4 statutory words correctly.

### **How you can help your child at home:**

Talk about the words they are learning to spell and what they mean. Use them in context to boost your child's understanding. Daily reading aloud and regular discussions about what they have read, especially the meaning of new words they meet in their books, is also beneficial. Completion of any homework set on Century Tech will also help your child progress.

## **Geography Climatic regions and biomes.**

You child will be investigating how geographers zone the world, naming and locating different biomes on world maps with particular attention being paid to comparing Polar and Tropical rainforest biomes.

### **How you can help your child at home:**

Each week, ask your child to tell you what they have learned in their geography lessons. Look through atlases and identify the different zones with your child. The weblink below also provides support:

## Maths

This half term, your child will be learning about fractions (equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions and whole numbers) and decimal fractions (tenths and 100ths) as well as dividing by 10 and 100. We will look at the different ways we can write a fraction (eg  $0.1 = 1/10$ ) We will continue to focus on their X table knowledge and their corresponding division facts for all of the times tables.

### **How you can help your child at home:**

Regular practice of times tables and the related division facts, using TTRockstars or quick fire questions from you.

Completing any homework set and discussing what fractions and decimals are (part of a whole)

## Science How do we hear?

Your child will learn all about sound and how we receive it. They will learn how sounds are made, how they travel, its pitch and volume and how sounds can be made by air vibrating.

They will learn to hypothesise Conduct an investigation using practical equipment and learn how record their findings.

### **How you can help your child at home:**

Ask your child to explain to you what they have learned about sound each week. Discuss the words that name the different parts of the inner ear and learn how to spell them at home.

E-safety - your child will be learning more about how to keep safe online and how to be a responsible internet user.

Writing for different audiences - they will be using various computer programmes to produce a variety of texts.

### How you can help your child at home:
